What does it take to be a successful social entrepreneur? Roopal Shah will share her perspective on the core skills and values needed to promote change within existing organizations or independent social initiatives. Her ability to revolutionize "business as usual" stems from her extensive work within the private, public, and nonprofit sectors. Ms. Shah will share her personal journey that began with promoting social change within the U of M Law School, a law firm in Washington DC, and led her to start a non-profit organization in India.

Roopal Shah is co-founder and executive director of Indicorps, a unique service organization promoting reconnection to India through service. She also co-leads the Ahmedabad Ultimate initiative to promote development through sport. A graduate of Harvard University and the University of Michigan Law School, Roopal practiced law for almost a decade—clerking for a federal district judge in Hawaii, practicing at a law firm in Washington, DC, and serving in San Diego for four years as a federal prosecutor. Roopal's journey from being the president of the UM Law School Student Senate to starting up non-profit outfits in India draws from her ability to cultivate the spirit of service in everyday life.
