### **Constitution Day Celebrated September 19; Chief Justice Robert P. Young, Jr. and Court of Appeals Judge Stephen Borello to Address Visitors to the Michigan Hall of Justice**

**Who:** Chief Justice Robert P. Young, Jr. and Court of Appeals Judge Stephen Borello will meet visitors to the Hall of Justice including fourth-grade students and adult participants from the Michigan State University Visiting International Professional Program.

**What:** Constitution Day Celebration

**When:** September 19, 2016

11:15 a.m. – Chief Justice Robert P. Young, Jr. will address Sandyview Elementary students in the Supreme Court courtroom on the sixth floor of the Hall of Justice. Students will visit the Learning Center at 10:30 a.m.

1:15 p.m. - Court of Appeals Judge Stephen Borello will address another group of students from Sandyview Elementary in the Court of Appeals courtroom on the second floor of the Hall of Justice. Students will visit the Learning Center at 12:30 p.m.

2:40 p.m. - Chief Justice Robert P. Young, Jr. will address participants from the MSU Visiting International Professional Program in the Supreme Court courtroom. The group will tour the Learning Center at 2 p.m.

**Why:** Federal law requires schools to teach about the Constitution on or near September 17, the date the Constitution was signed in 1787. The U.S. Constitution embodies the United States' founding principles, including the rule of law. Constitution Day resources are available on the Michigan Supreme Court [Learning Center](#) web site.
