Michigan Supreme Court Learning Center’s ‘A Day in Court’ Educational Game Now Available Online

LANSING, MI, April 20, 2018 – The Michigan Judicial Institute announced today that “[A Day in Court](#),” which will be featured in the Learning Center’s Courtroom Exhibit, is now online. The educational game can be used pre- or post-tour, or as a separate activity.

This interactive game helps players learn more about the judicial branch of government. In particular, it highlights the work of trial courts – the courts closest to the people where most cases are heard. For example, the game helps players learn about important roles in our justice system, including witnesses, juries, prosecutors, defense attorneys and judges.

MJI also offers a companion piece to the game, called “[Educator Resources](#),” which includes links to lessons, a glossary, curriculum connections, technical information, and tips for contacting legal professionals in your community.
