

About the Learning Center

The Michigan Supreme Court Learning Center is located in the Michigan Hall of Justice, headquarters of the state's judicial branch of government.

The Learning Center's exhibit gallery is filled with hands-on activities designed for visitors from elementary school to adult. Topics include:

- Role and structure of Michigan's judicial branch of government.
- U.S. Constitution and Michigan Constitution.
- Roles in a trial, such as the judge, lawyers, witnesses, and jury.



Location

The Learning Center is on the first floor of the Michigan Hall of Justice, Lansing. The building is north of the Michigan Historical Center (across Allegan Street) and six blocks west of the State Capitol.

Hours

Monday–Friday, 9 a.m.–4 p.m. Closed on state holidays.

Tours


Docent-led tours are available for groups of ten or more. Individual walk-in visitors are welcome. For reservations, call 517-373-7171.
