

Frequently Asked Questions – Added in 2016

Are statutory and ordinance offenses included in the CCIC data?

Yes, the CCIC report captures court costs assessed pursuant to MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iii), without regard to whether the case itself is a statutory (for example SM) or ordinance violation (for example OM).

Does the CCIC report include civil infractions?

No, the CCIC report does not include civil infractions.

Which case types are included in the CCIC information?

The CCIC report includes data on the following case types:

- Circuit Court Criminal Division: AX, FC, FH, FJ
- Circuit Court Family Division: DJ
- District/Municipal Court Criminal Cases: EX, FY, OM, SM, FD, FT, OD, OT, SD, ST

Are court appointed counsel fees included on the CCIC report?

No, fees for court appointed representation are not part of CCIC. The expenses of providing legal assistance to the defendant is listed separately in MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iv). The CCIC report is limited to the court costs listed in MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iii). (*Emphasis added.*)

Can the CCIC report data be used to calculate an average court cost assessed at each court?

Court costs can vary within a court and this variation would not be evident in the average per court.

Can the CCIC report be used to calculate a court's collection rates?

No, the CCIC report provides data on court costs alone. It excludes other assessments collected by the court.
